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There is a logical compromise between overt sexuality and burkha-shrouded oppression of women. In India, for instance, Hindu culture encourages modesty in dress without imposing the covering of one's face. As a democratic nation with a tolerant Hindu majority, modesty is not enforced upon women by laws or violence, but encouraged by societal norms.

Thus, one can find sari -clad women alongside jeans and skirts in the streets of India, with the call centers and the numerous research facilities mushrooming all over the nation. In short, India is a land of equality and opportunity for both men and women.

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
